DISCONNECTING SUMP PUMPS

Sump pumps and sump pits can be used to manage stormwater that is entering your basement. Where you discharge this collected water is important. Do not connect to the wastewater system unless prior approved by Halifax Water. Removing the sump pump and allowing the sump pit to drain by gravity is preferred to avoid mechanical issues and power costs.



DO:

Discharge to the ground, away from your foundation. Cap the old discharge pipe.

AVOID:

Flooding your neighbour. Icing problems in the street/sidewalks.
